Mr ALAN LUBY HONORED.

Mr. Alan S. Luby, formerly of Illawarra District Ambulance and now of A.M.C., A.I.R., has received the following from Mr. J. McKay, Commissioner of Police—

Dear Sir.—I have had under consideration Police reports in connection with the death of Constable Dunn, and two other persons at Wollongong, on 25th April last. The police reports disclose that you went to the assistance of the Police, and at no small risk to yourself assisted to remove the body of the deceased constable to a position where first aid could be safely rendered if necessary.

It is desired to convey to you the highest appreciation of the Police Authorities of the courage manifested by you on the occasion in question, and thanks for your co-operation with the police in connection with these tragic happenings. It is asked that you will be good enough to accept the accompanying certificate of appreciation as a token of appreciation.
