Vale Arthur Marshall

On 12 November 2013, shortly before our commemoration ceremony in Kings Park, Harvey's cricketing and farming legend, Arthur Marshall, passed away, aged 91, surrounded by his family. Hundreds of people recently gathered at the Harvey Recreation and Cultural Centre to celebrate Arthur's life. Raised on the family farm, "Tama Grove", near Broomehill, Arthur was the ninth child in a family of eleven children. His mother died when he was six and his father when he was thirteen. Arthur joined the unit in 1941 and served in Timor, New Guinea and New Britain. 
