TIMORESE VETERANS VISIT 2016

29 veterans of Timor-Leste's struggle for national liberation visited Australia to meet with members of Australia's veteran community and participated in events commemorating ANZAC Day on the 25th of April.

Delegations were based in Perth, Sydney, Brisbane and Canberra with a small delegation travelling between key cities. Minister of Planning and Strategic Investment, and Chief Negotiator for Maritime Boundaries, HE Kay Rala Xanana Gusmão led the visit.

In each location, including Perth, the veterans visited facilities that have been developed to support ex-service personnel, participated in ANZAC Day commemorations and met with members of the Timorese Community.

A group led by Colonel Falur Rate Laek representing the Defence Forces of Timor-Leste investigated walking treks in two National Parks to assist in planning the development of similar treks in the mountains of Timor-Leste. This group will be assessing the tourism potential of this idea and the opportunities it can provide for veterans to share the story of the Resistance.

KEITH HAYES PRESENTED WITH GIFT

The Association was honoured to have HE Xanana Gusmão march in the ANZAC Day Parade with Keith Hayes, as one of the 2/2 contingent.

HE Xanana Gusmão presented Keith with the flag of FALINTIL to express appreciation for his 'lifetime of kindness toward Timor-Leste'.

Keith was the only survivor of the infamous ration truck massacre on the outskirts of Dili following the Japanese invasion of Portuguese Timor in February 1942. Keith would not have survived without the care provided by a local

Timorese woman, Berta Martins, who tended his wounds and assisted him in re-joining his comrades.
